

Swim team gets 3rd Oberlin youth win events at league meet

The Oberlin Swim Club took third at the Northwest Kansas League Swim Meet in Oakley over the weekend.

It was the highest place in several years for the team, which has been finishing fourth or fifth at most meets.

Heather Glodt set three new pool records and five Oberlin swimmers ended up among the top competitors in their categories.

LeAnna Sheaffer took first, Glodt second and Molly Coleman, fifth, for 15-18 year old girls; Darbi Rouse, fourth for 9-10 girls; and Tyler Shields, fifth for 11-12 boys.

Glodt beat records set by Kristen Heinrich, Goodland, in 1999 in the 100-yard freestyle, and 1997 in the 100-yard butterfly, and N. Williamson, Holyoke, in 2002 in the 100-yard breaststroke.

Glodt; Kiah Blau; Ganon Henningson; the 15-18 mixed medley relay team of Coleman, Gabe Moore, Sheaffer and Macy Rouse; the 15-18 mixed medley relay team of Coleman, Moore, Sheaffer and Glodt; and the 9-10 girls medley relay team of Kaylee May, Jamie Soderlund, Mika Hackney and Alexandria Auxier took first places.
