## Farm program deadline set

Deadline for the U.S. Farm Service Agency to accept applications under the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program for this year's crops will be Thursday, Sept. 1.

This program covers crops which are not insurable. Included are all small grain crops except oats, plus aquaculture, canola, Christmas

trees, nursery crops, speltz and turf grass sod.

This coverage entitles farmers to a payment of 55 percent of the average market price for the commodity if a natural disaster causes a 50 percent or greater production loss.
