Oberlin grad honored

Arnold Janousek, a 1948 graduate of Decatur Community High School, was featured recently in a story in the *Billings Gazette* at Billings, Mont.

A native of Decatur County, he was born in 1930 and said he has seen many changes throughout the years. He began his pursuit of education in 1936 by attending first grade and continued through 2005 when he received his Doctor of Philosophy degree in mathematics from Oaklands University, London, England.

His elementary school education was completed in the Kanona District No. 68 in Kansas. He attended Decatur Community High School in Oberlin and after graduating in 1948, he attended Kansas State University his freshman year. He attended his sophomore through se-

nior years at Fort Hays State University. In 1952, he entered the Army and served for two years. After returning home, he returned to Hays, where he obtained a masters degree in mathematics.

He started working on his doctorate at the University of Kansas in 1956, and married two years later. He had three children, Guy, Cecile and Jennifer. He left Kansas University after seven years to work for Trans World Airlines.

After retiring from the airline, he started working for the Bureau of Indian Affairs in Lawrence and eventually transferred to Billings in 1992. He continued to pursue his work as a computer specialist after moving to Billings, then in 2005, he reached a lifelong goal when he received his Doctor of Philosophy degree in London.
