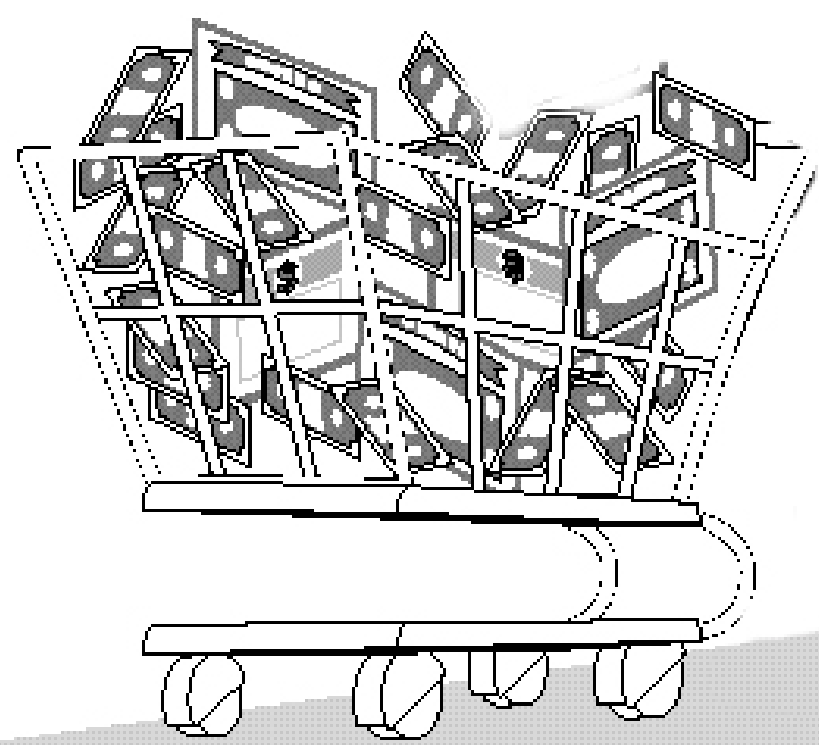
## Midway News
