Farm forms have changed

A new Loan Deficiency Payment form should simplify this program for farmers, says Bill R. Fuller, state executive director of the U.S. Farm Service Agency.

"In the past, many farmers have failed to submit an LDP request before beneficial interest was lost in the commodity, which made them ineligible for benefits," he said. "The new form ... when filed before loss of beneficial interest, allows farmers to indicate their intention to receive LDP benefits."

"The second page allows farmers to submit an LDP request for benefits at any time during the loan/LDP availability period, whether they have maintained beneficial interest or not. Farmers must have a Page 1 on file before they can sub-

mit Page 2 or Page 3." The county Farm Service Agency office will be holding meetings soon to explain the form and have farmers sign the first page.
