'Cheap Grace vs. Costly Grace' By Pastor Heidi Weibe of Evangelical Covenant Church

In our adult Sunday School class this summer, out requiring repentance, baptism without church diswe have been watching films about individuals who made a mark on the church — people like St. Patrick, Luther and Dietrich Bonhoeffer.

All of them lived out the reality of Jesus' words, "If you want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For what will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life? Or what will they give in return for their life." (Matt. 16: 24-25)

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a Christian man who spoke out against Hitler and his policies. His outspokenness got him thrown in jail and just a few days before the concentration camp he was in was liberated, he was executed.

He wrote a book, "The Cost of Discipleship", in which he speaks about the idea of cheap grace.

He said, "Cheap grace is the deadly enemy of our church. We are fighting today for costly grace. Cheap grace is the grace we bestow upon ourselves. Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness with-

cipline. Cheap grace is a grace without discipleship, grace without the cross. Costly grace is the treasure hidden in a field—the pearl of great price. It is the call of Jesus Christ, at which the disciple leaves his nets and follows him.'

Costly grace means serving others with our time, talents and treasure. Costly grace is unlimited forgiveness, no matter how we have been hurt. Costly grace is being willing to own our faults and then change our lives. Costly grace means just what Jesus said, denying ourselves, taking up the cross and following after Christ, no matter where it might lead us.

For Bonhoeffer, denying oneself, taking up the cross and following after Jesus, was not cheap. For Bonhoeffer, it was very costly, in fact, it cost him his

For each person who decides to follow Jesus Christ, they must ask themselves, not "What's in it for me?" but, "What do you want from me?"
