Oberlin Speedway holds races during Decatur County Fair

After two attempts to start the race with a caution, officials lined the cars up single-file on the third try. However the yellow flew on that attempt before Tyson Garrison finally took the point on the fourth try. One lap was completed, then the caution waved twice before the next restart. Murray took the lead on lap 3 and never looked back, even though several more cautions kept the field bunched. Ronnie Wallace inched out Garrison for second at the checkers, with Brice Riley and Jay Steffens rounding out the top five. Heat race winners were Don Hagan Jr., Murray and Doug Holzmeister.

Josh Hudson of Athol won the IMCA Stock Car feature but was challenged by Tyler Hahn most of the race. Hudson and Hahn both got past first-lap leader Caleb Peters on the second lap and the chase was on. Hahn tried several times to get under Hudson in the corners, but just could not make the pass. Hahn faded to fourth on the last couple of laps as Cory Struckhoff and Bryan Lariviere drove by to finish second and third. Jason Schoenberger was fifth. Hudson and Bob Chalupa won the two heat races.

Todd Pankonin of Benkleman, Neb., took the lead on lap 2 from Brian Conness and drove away to


