

# Oberlin takes seventh, eighth in McCook meet

The Oberlin boys came in eighth and the girls seventh in the tough McCook Invitational cross country meet on Thursday.

The Heritage Hills Golf Course in McCook, which lives up to its name, has a 5,000-meter boys course for a little over three miles, said Coach Dick Ahlberg.

Sophomore Becky Helm was the only Decatur Community High runner to win a medal, taking 12th in 17 minutes, 42 seconds.

"Becky had a good race," Coach Ahlberg said. "She got out at the start and really competed."

"Anne Wasson had her best race of the season to date."

"Our boys are running together in a pretty strong pack. They got out quick the first half-mile and were not afraid to compete."

"This was a big, tough meeting,

with some of the best Nebraska schools competing on a challenging course.

"This is a learning experience for all of our runners. Our times were improved significantly from last year. It was a nice show of improvement."

Senior Whitney Beinke came in 18th for the Oberlin girls in 18:41 followed by Lora Marietta, 29th, 19:19; Nikki Lincoln, 54th, 22; Wasson, 59th, 23:09; and Danica May, 61st, 23:31.

Andy Leitner was the first Oberlin boy across the finish line. He came in 33rd in 20:13, followed by Teryn Grafel, 39th, 20:47; Kellen Doeden, 40th, 20:48; Aaron Helm, 42nd, 21:13; Brent Stallman, 55th, 22:24; and Corbin Sherlock, 59th, 23:43.

Running junior varsity for the Devils were Zeke Ruzicka, 22:30;

Scott Miller, 25:30; Cody Haas, 27; and Cameron Nedland, 27:40.

Ogallala won the boys division with 12 points, followed by North Platte, 55; Holdrege, 73; Imperial, 80; Dundy County, 86; McCook, 102; Grant, 108; Oberlin, 141; Cozad, 155; Cambridge, 170; and Maxwell, 185.

Gothenburg won the girls division with 24, followed by North Platte, 55; Ogallala, 70; Holdrege, 76; Grant, 93; Imperial, 98; Oberlin, 98; McCook, 128; SouthWest, 155; Sutherland, 171; Dundy County, 183; and Maywood, 215.

Thursday, the Red Devil runners will take off at 5 p.m. in Hill City.

On Tuesday, Oberlin will play host to the 38th annual Oberlin Invitational starting at 5 p.m. at the Oberlin Country Club.

"We did not play well as a team the entire night," Coach Pat Dorshorst said. "We have all kinds of talent, but hit the floor against Hill City very lethargic. We need to get fired up to play every match and get consistent in our play."

"The first game against Oakley is probably the best game we have played all season. We came out from the locker room fired up and stayed fired up throughout the game."

"The second game against Oakley, we hit a few balls out of bounds early and backed off. Oakley is a

very scrappy team and they took advantage of the breaks. Oakley played outstanding defense and we backed off offensively. This cost us the match.

"The third game was a fight to the end. Oakley jumped to an early lead and Oberlin kept chopping down the lead until the match was tied at 21-21. Oberlin missed the serve and their composure. Oakley served the game out 21-25.

"If Oberlin gets consistent, we are going to be a team to contend with. We need to keep our heads in the game, know where the other team's weaknesses are and take advantage of them."

"We cannot back off offensively or defensively. Other teams will not give the games to us."

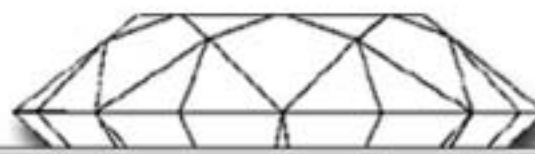

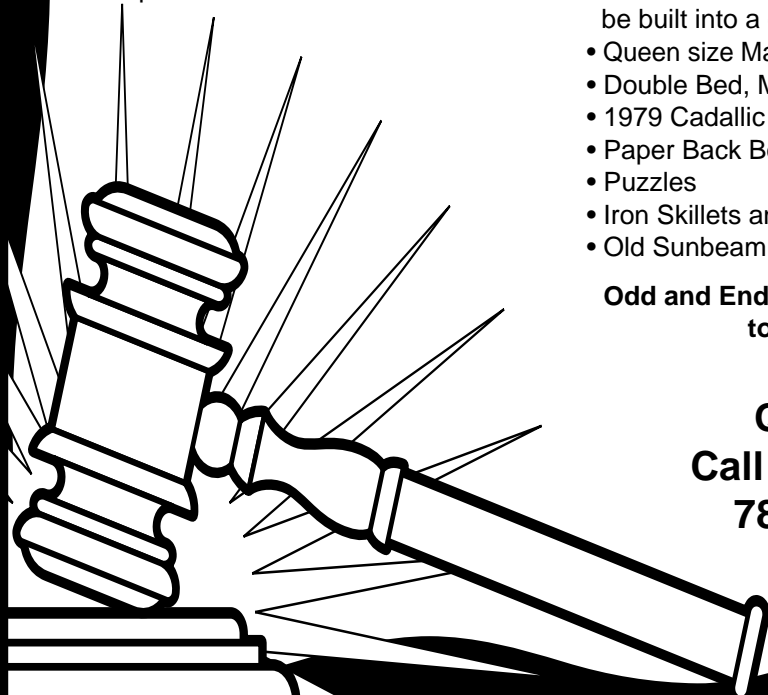
