AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING SUNDAY SALES OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR AND CEREAL MALT BEVERAGE IN THE ORIGINAL PACKAGE WITHIN THE CITY OF OBERLIN

BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the City of Oberlin, Kansas:

Section 1. Pursuant to 2005 Kan. Sess. Laws, Ch. 201, the sale at retail of cereal malt beverage in the original package is allowed between the hours of 12:00 noon and 8:00 p.m.

Section 2. Pursuant to 2005 Kan. Sess Laws, Ch. 201, the sale at retail of alcoholic liquor in the original package is allowed within the city on any Sunday, except Easter, between the hours of 12:00 noon and 8:00 p.m. and sales shall be allowed on Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day

Section 3. This ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official city newspaper.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect 61 days after final publication or on November 15, 2005, whichever is later, unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed, requiring a referendum to be held on the ordinance as provided in 2005 Kan. Sess. Laws, Ch. 201, in which case this ordinance shall become effective upon approval by a majority of the electors
