Leah Marietta, a sophomore at Kansas State University, was a member of the 10-woman team that represented the United States at the Junior World Powerlifting Championship held Sept. 7-11 at Fort Wayne, Ind.

The team placed second, with the Russians taking first. There were 242 lifters from 21 countries competing. Leah lifted in the 114-pound class and placed fifth. She holds the American record in the squat, which she set by lifting 348 pounds at the Hawkeye Open on Aug. 7 in Sioux City, Iowa.

Her sister, Lora Marietta, a senior at Decatur Community High School, set an American record in the bench press at the Beemer Barbell Open on May 21, in Beemer, Neb.

Both girls have been invited to be on the U.S. women's team for the Pan-American Powerlifting Championship in Miami this November. Their parents are Alan and Judith Marietta of Oberlin.
