The Decatur Community High Red Devils fell 14-6 to the Rawlins County Buffaloes on Friday for their second straight loss, taking their season record to 3-2.


Oberlin started its season off with a bang, downing St. Francis, Quinter and Colby on successive Fridays before falling to Goodland last
