Two Oberlin girls get medals at meet

Two Oberlin girls got medals but both boys and girls Decatur Community High cross country teams finished in sixth place at the Phillipsburg Invitational on Thursday.

Senior Whitney Beinke took 10th place in 13 minutes, 54 seconds and for the first time this year outran sophomore Rebecca Helm, who came in 12th in 13:57. Both got medals.

Other Oberlin girls running were Lora Marietta, 25th, 14:58; Nikki Lincoln, 42nd, 16:19; Anne Wasson, 45th, 16:27; and Danica May, 49th, 17:30.

Senior Teryn Grafel was the first Oberlin boy across the line, 25th in 20:40. He was followed by Kellen Doeden, 27th, 20:49; Aaron Helm, 36th, 22:22; Zeke Ruzicka, 38th, 22:42; Corbin Sherlock, 41st,

23:12; and Brent Stallman, 42nd, 23:30.

Junior varsity runners were Scott Miller, 13th, 23:36; Cody Haas, 18th, 24:54; and Cameron Nedland, 21st, 27:55.

Andrew Dempewolf ran but Andy Leitner was out with a back injury.

Norton took first for the boys with 45 points, followed by Ellis, 66; WaKeeney, 75; Phillipsburg, 83; Hill City, 90; Oberlin, 143.

Lakeside took first for the girls with 65 points, followed by Osborne, 72; Hill City, 74; Norton, 80; Phillipsburg, 89; and Oberlin, 104.

The Oberlin runners will be at the Northwest Kansas League championships at 11 a.m. Saturday at the golf course in Hoxie.

Red Devil junior varsity whips Atwood 30-6

The Oberlin junior varsity football team beat Rawlins County 30-6 on Oct. 3 in their last home game.

Jebb Tally drew first blood on an eight-yard run into the end zone in the first quarter to put Oberlin on the board. A two-point conversion pass from Jace Robinson to Andy Gilliam took the score to 8-0.

In the second quarter, Oberlin added another 8 points as Robinson scored a touchdown on a 19-yard run and Tally ran the conversion.

Tally did all the scoring in the third quarter, as he ran Oberlin's

third touchdown in on an 11-yard dash and took in the conversion to give the young Red Devils a 24-0 lead over the Buffaloes.

In the fourth quarter, Tally scored again, this time on a 10-yard run, but the conversion was no good and Oberlin led 30-0.

Rawlins County, however, wasn't going home without a fight. The Buffaloes scored their only touchdown on a 17-yard run. The extra point run was no good and Oberlin won 30-6.

"It was a very nice win for us,"

Coach Keith Grafel said. "Rawlins County has a very good junior varsity team. Our defense played very, very well, and our offense move the ball on some good scoring drives.

"We had a few mistakes, but they didn't hurt us too bad.

"Our running backs really ran hard, and I felt, our offensive line got the job done most of the time."

The junior varsity was to play its last game in Oakley on Monday.

"The Red Devil junior varsity team is now 4-9 and looking forward to a really tough game at Oakley,"

Coach Grafel said after the Rawlins County game.

"This will be a tough game for us, and it will take a total team effort to come away from Oakley with a win.

"It should be a great game."

GENERAL NOTICE TO CONTROL NOXIOUS WEEDS

The Kansas Noxious Weed Law K.S.A. 2-1314 et seq requires all persons who own or supervise land in Kansas to control and eradicate all weeds declared noxious by legislative action. The weeds declared noxious are: Field Bindweed, Musk Thistle, Serica Lespedeza, Johnson Grass, Canada Thistle, Bur Ragweed, Leafy Spurge, Hoary Cress, Quack Grass, Russian Knapweed, Kudzu, & Pignut. Multiflora Rose is a County Option Noxious Weed declared noxious by the Board of County Commissioners of Decatur County. Notice is hereby given pursuant to the Kansas Noxious Weed Law to every person who owns or supervises land in Decatur County that noxious weeds growing or found on such land shall be controlled and eradicated. Control is defined as preventing the production of viable seeds and the vegetative spread of the plant.

Failure to observe this notice may result in the County:

1. Serving a legal notice requiring control of the noxious weeds within a minimum of 5 days. Failure to control the noxious weeds within the time period allowed may result in the county treating the noxious weeds at the landowners expense and placing a lien on the property if the bill is not paid within 30 days or,
2. filing criminal charges for non compliance. Conviction for non compliance may result in a fine of \$100 per day of non compliance with a maximum fine of \$1500.

The public is also hereby notified that it is a violation of Kansas Noxious Weed Law to barter, sell, or give away infested nursery stock or livestock feed unless the feed is fed on the farm where grown or sold to a commercial processor that will destroy the viability of the noxious weed seed. Custom harvesting machines must be labeled with a label provided by the Kansas Dept. of Agriculture and must be free of all weed seed and litter when entering the State and when leaving a field infested with noxious weeds.
