




Vocal teacher Jim Buchholz, who will direct the play, said all of the students had to try out for their parts for the musical, "When in Rome." There are 25 kids in the cast, mostly sixth graders, although there are some fifth graders too.

The musical, said Mr. Buchholz, is about a petty thief who ends up having to fight a gladiator to win the heart of a princess. Although it is a musical, he said it is also a comedy. Mr. Buchholz said he enjoys directing the musical each year. It is a good way to introduce kids to theater and let them find out how much work is involved in a production like this. This gives kids a chance to sing solos and act.

Each student is responsible for their own costumes, although he has some parents who have been helping out, including Kelly Shields, Jeni Henningson and Maureen Anderson. He said Anita Hirsch and Jeanette Diederich have helped with the backdrop for the musical.

The musical will start at 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 25, in the grade school gym. Admission is free.
