The Oberlin Red Devils started district football play in fine fashion Friday night with a 55-0 shutout of the Stockton Tigers.

The Decatur Community High team seemed to be back on track after some mixed results this season.

The Red Devils came out and beat the tough St. Francis Indians in the opener then downed Quinter and Colby in quick succession.

After that, the Oberlin boys lost three in a row to the Goodland Cowboys, Atwood Buffaloes and Oakley Plainsmen to come up with an even 3-3 record.

Friday, however, the Red Devils stomped the Tigers into the grass of Oberlin's Smick Field to the delight of hometown fans.

"Friday night against Stockton was a very good team effort," Coach Trevor Williams said. "I thought all our guys did a good job in their execution and effort. We were able to run and pass the ball offensively and with a lot of success. Our blockers did a great job opening up holes for our backs against Stockton.

"Defensively, our guys did a good job as well. Any time you get a shut-out, you've played well on defense."

The Hill City game starts at 7 p.m. The Hoxie game will be in Oberlin and also will start at 7 p.m.
