The Oberlin volleyball team bedeviled all the opposition at the Class 3A substate tournament Saturday in Phillipsburg, winning a trip to the state tournament in Salina this

The Decatur Community High volleyball team wasn't content to rest on its laurels as Northwest League champions, a title the girls won barely a week ago. Saturday, the Oberlin girls went to Phillipsburg and whipped Norton, Phillipsburg and Holcomb to win a trip to the Bicentennial Center this weekend for the Class 3A state volleyball championships.

The substate tournament was single elimination, with Holcomb. 29-5, seeded as No. 1; Phillipsburg, 25-5, No. 2; Oberlin, 24-5, No. 3; Cimarron, 21-12, No. 4; Lakin, 21-13, No. 5; Norton, 14-14, No. 6; and Beloit, 14-14, No. 7. As No. 1 seed, Holcomb got a first-round by ewhile Oberlin took on Norton.

The Oberlin Lady Devils plucked the Lady Blue Jays in two straight, 26-24, 25-12.

"Norton has an aggressive ball club," Coach Pat Dorshorst said. "Oberlin did not shut the net down in the first game. This allowed Norton to be on the offensive. Once Oberlin started blocking and hitting the ball rather than free balls, they took control of the match."
