# Red Devils secure post-season berth with win

## Oberlin downs Hill City, 58-6

Hunting season opened early for the Oberlin Red Devils, as they shot down the Ringnecks 58-6 Friday, giving the team a shot at post-season play for the second year in a row. It was the second week in a row that younger Oberlin players got onto the field, as Oberlin scored 15 points each the first and second quarters to Hill City's single touchdown in the second for a 30-6 lead at the half.

The Oberlin added 14 more points in each of the third and fourth quarters.

"Friday's game against Hill City was a good win for our football team," Coach Trevor Williams said. "That win guaranteed us a spot in the playoffs this year."

"The game itself was a very good game from all aspects of our football

team.

"Offensively, our team was very productive both rushing and passing.

"Defensively we gave up only one score and were able to control them most of the evening."

Oberlin scoring started in the first quarter when Hill City made a safety, giving the Red Devils 2 points. The Red Devils were able to add another 13 points on a pair of touchdowns in the first quarter.

Quarterback Denton Bailey tossed a 47-yard pass to Jason Thomas for the first one and Josh Fortin made the point after.

Then Bailey made a one-yard run into the end zone for another 6

points. The point after was no good but Oberlin lead 15-0 at the end of one.

In the second quarter, Jebb Tally made a 40-yard run to score and Bailey threw a two-point conversion to Jesse Juenemann.

Oberlin made another touchdown when Bailey tossed a 27-yard pass to Thomas. Fortin kicked the extra point.

Hill City made its only score of the evening on an eight-yard touchdown pass and at the end of the first half, Oberlin lead 30-6.

In the third quarter, J. Juenemann ran 57 yards for a touchdown and Bailey hit Thomas with a 60-yard pass for 6. Fortin kicked both points

after to take the score to 44-6.

In the fourth quarter, Jonathon Richards ran into the end zone for Oberlin's seventh touchdown and Fortin kicked the point after. Chet Ely made a one-yard touchdown run for the last touchdown and Ryan McEvoy kicked in the final point to make the score 58-6.

Richards was Oberlin's top rusher, gaining 109 yards on 12 carries and a touchdown. He was followed by J. Juenemann, 70 yards on two carries and a touchdown; Tally, 91 yards on six carries and a touchdown; Josh Fortin, 52 yards on seven carries; Lucas Juenemann, 30 yards on five carries; Bailey, four yards on four carries and a touch-

down; and Ely, three yards on three carries and a touchdown.

Bailey was four for seven in the air for 148 yards and three touchdowns. He was intercepted once. Receivers were Thomas, 136 yards on three grabs for all three touchdowns, and J. Juenemann, one for 12 yards.

Tacklers were Thomas, three solo, eight assists and a fumble recovery; Fortin, one solo, seven assists; J. Juenemann, two solo, four assists; Jacob Unger, six assists, one interception; Terry Urban, one solo, four assists; Ely, two solo, two assists and one fumble recovery; Bailey and Garrit Peters, one solo and three assists each; Joe Mondero, one solo and two assists; Jace Robinson and Royal Fisher, one solo and one assist each; Drew Mar-

tin, three assists; Richards, two assists; and Nolan May, Andy Gilliam and Kyle Glodt, one assist each.

The Red Devils will play their last district contest starting at 7 p.m. Thursday at home against the Hoxie Indians.

The Indians have already downed both Hill City and Stockton, the other teams in the district, so both Oberlin and Hoxie will be going on to the playoffs.

However, the better team will get to play a lower-seeded opponent in the bidistrict game, plus home-field advantage.

"This Thursday will be a big game, as both teams will be playing for a district title," Coach Williams said. "The game will be exciting. Our kids are going to be fired up for this one."

## Olympian speaks at college

Rulon Gardner spoke on his experiences in the 2000 and 2004 Olympics at a fund-raising event for the Colby Community College wrestling program last week at the Community Building.

Gardner won the gold medal in 2000 and the bronze in 2004. He

donated a pair of his wrestling shoes to the college, which were auctioned at the end of the talk by Rich Epp. They brought over \$700.

Proceeds from the auction and donations for the meal will be used for scholarships for the wrestling program. Over 350 people attended.

Mr. Gardner also donated the proceeds from the sale of his book, "Never Stop Pushing," at the event.
