

Judge Charles A. Elliott, 66, Olathe, a retired Johnson County district court judge, died Thursday, Dec. 1, 2005, at his home in Olathe.

in St. Louis. After attending the University of Kansas, he received a bachelor's degree from Baker University in 1962 and a juris doctor from Washburn University School of Law in 1965. He was admitted to the practice of law in the state and federal courts of Kansas in July 1965; the Supreme Court of the United States in June 1971; and the state and federal courts of Missouri in Sep-

tember 1982. His legal career included being elected magistrate judge in Johnson County in 1968 and 1972, and associate district judge in 1976. He was involved in legal practice in Mission, Olathe, and Kansas City, Mo., and was assistant general counsel for Marion Laboratories 1980-82. The American Academy of Judicial Education selected him to lecture and make presentations across the nation during the 1970s, and he taught political, social science, and paralegal courses at Johnson County Community College.

Judge Elliott was a member of the American, Missouri, Kansas and Johnson County bar associations, the Association of Trial Lawyers of America, and the Kansas Trial Lawyer's Association. He was involved in community and charitable organizations including the Johnson County Historical Society, Regional Council on Alcoholism and the Baker University Board of Trustees. Since 1988, he had volunteered

with the Olathe Trailblazers Special Olympics team. He was the driving force behind organizing the Olathe Special Olympics softball, basketball and volleyball programs and coached a team in each of these sports. In 1995, Judge Elliott was selected by Kansas Special Olympics as their World Games tennis coach for the 1995 International Special Olympics in New Haven, Conn. In 2003, he was an honored guest at the Special Olympics World Games in Dublin, Ireland. In 2003, the Kansas Parks and Recreation Association honored him with its Distinguished Volunteer Award for the many hours he gave to the City of Olathe adaptive recreation pro-

He is survived by his wife; a daughter, Laura, of Olathe; and nieces Lynda Zeis, Seattle, and Eleni Palmisano, Olympia, Wash.


