Goldie Faye (Hanson) Dorson, 90, a 1934 graduate of Decatur Community High School, died Dec. 2, 2005, in Green Cove Springs, Fla. In Pueblo, she operated a day care center, and was a member of St. Paul's United Methodist Church and the Over-40 Club. She was born Aug. 24, 1940, in Sioux City, Iowa, one of two daughters of John and Leona (Uehlin) Smith. Her family moved to Oberlin when she was a child. She attended Oberlin Elementary School and graduated from Decatur Community High School in 1958. She received a degree in accounting at Emporia State Teachers College. Over the years, she worked as a public accountant and lived in Colorado, West Virginia, Florida and New Hampshire. Most recently she was an administrator of special assets for a bank in Birmingham. She also held a real estate license. She worked in the greyhound circuit, training dogs, and was proud to be one of the first women to be a judge for the Greyhound Racing Association. Her interests and hobbies included the love of puppies and music of all kinds. She held a special place in her heart for her nephews and nieces. Survivors include her sister and brother-in-law, Ardith and Dean Louderback, and family, and stepfather, Ira Kolsky and wife, Mary, Oberlin. Arnold Janousek, 75, a native of Decatur County, died Thursday, Dec. 1, 2005, at his home in Billings, Mont. He was born Jan. 9, 1930, in Kanona, the son of Fred and Edythe Louise (Rohr) Janousek, and graduated from Decatur Community High School in 1948. He earned a Bachelor of Science in math and physics from Fort Hays State Teachers College in 1952. He entered the U.S. Army in 1952 during the Korean War and served with the 508th Military Police Battalion in Munich, Germany. He was discharged as a sergeant in 1954. In 1956, he earned a master's degree in math and physics at the University of Kansas. He received a Doctor of Philosophy degree from Oakland University in London, England. He served as an assistant instructor in the math department and assistant director of the computer center at Kansas University. He worked in the engineering application department of Trans World Airlines in Kansas City as a project systems analyst from 1963 to 1983. In 1984, he joined the Bureau of Indian Affairs at Haskell Indian Nations University as a computer specialist. In 1992, he moved to Billings, where he continued work with the bureau until this year. He served for 16 years as scoutmaster for Boy Scout Troop 52 in Lawrence and continued to be active with scouting after moving to Billings in 1992. He was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. He was married on Dec. 29, 1957, to Eleanor Ruth Deeter in Norcat and they had three children, Guy and Keri Austin Janousek of Lawrence;

She was preceded in death by her husband in 1989; her parents; two brothers, Richard Adams and Elbert Adams; and a sister, Mildred Wilcox. Services will be held at 10:30 a.m. today at Memorial United Methodist Church in McCook with the Rev. Dr. Jeffery Thurman officiating. Burial will be at Memorial Park Cemetery at McCook. 1946, he was a sheet metal worker in Grant before moving to Denver to become a watchmaker. On May 27, 1950, he married Lois G. Jordan in Grant. They moved to Oberlin where he was hired by Don Zimmerman to work in his jewelry store. In 1962 he took over management of the Oberlin American Legion Club. He later operated the Alibi Club for four years before opening a liquor store. They retired in 1984 and four years later the couple moved to Arizona, where they lived until returning to Oberlin in 1995. He was a member of the Oberlin American Legion Post, the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the 2nd Marine Division Association. He attended reunions of his Marine unit, took part in veterans' parades in Oberlin and attended the Veterans Day program at Oberlin Elementary School. Survivors include his wife; a son, John A. Lamb Jr. and wife Francheska of Topeka; a sister, Cleone and Thurman Armstrong of Arizona City, Ariz.; and two step-grandsons. He was preceded in death by his parents; a daughter-in-law, Patricia Lamb; two brothers, Myron and Charles Lamb; and a sister, Elaine Lamb. Funeral services were held Friday at Pauls Funeral Home in Oberlin with the Rev. George Kochuvellikkam officiating. Burial was at Fort McPherson National Cemetery in Maxwell, Neb., with military rites by the North Platte Honor Guard. 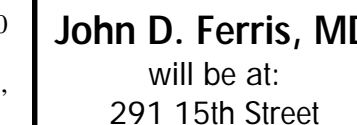
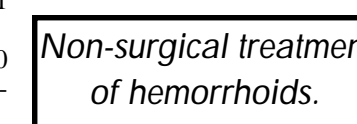
