On Friday, the Golden Plains Bulldogs downed Oberlin, 60-35.


"I knew going into this game that we would have to play really good to get the win," Coach Ream said. "Golden Plains has a real athletic team and can play really good bas-

Inman had two steals and Juenemann, Robinson and May, one each. On Friday, the Golden Plains Bulldogs whipped Oberlin 53-31.


We had a tough time," Coach Ahlberg said. "We shot poorly and our offensive execution was not good. The assist-turnover ratio was six to nine.


