Imagine what life would be like if it was winter, day in and day out, 365 days a year, endless winter without the joy and celebration of Christmas. It would suck the life and hope right out

That was the case for all those who lived in Narnia. When Lucy stumbles through the wardrobe into Narnia, she learns that it is the White Witch who has "made a magic so that it is always winter in Narnia — but it never gets to be Christmas." Hope comes to Narnia when word comes that Witch and he will be able to reverse the cold of winter. When Aslan comes into Narnia, the snow ered from the power of the White Witch.
