Chad Williams started the game at pitcher and was followed by setup man Brandon Montalvo; Toby Peters was used as the closer, finishing the game. "We did some good

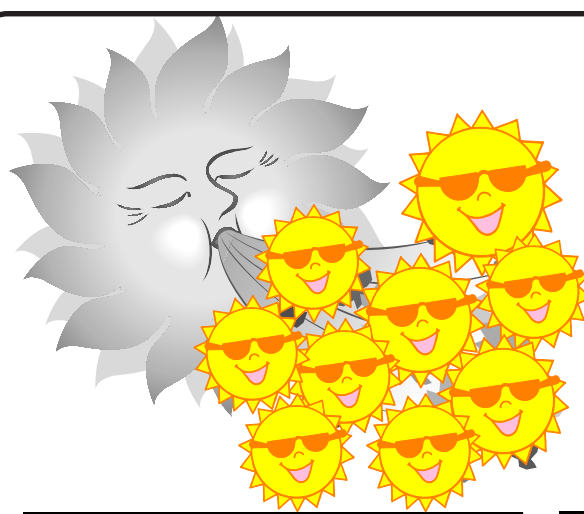
things and are continuing to improve," Andersen said. "The boys hit the ball well and put some runs up."

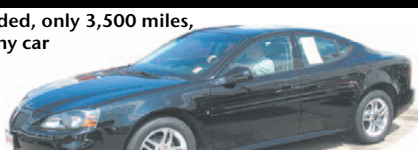

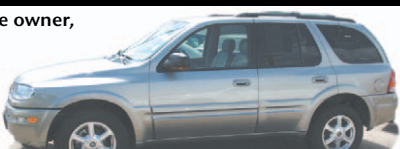

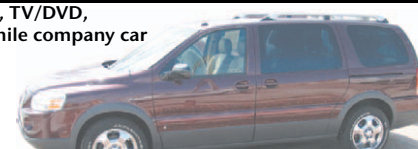
