Eldon Auker

Norcatur, died Aug. 4, 2006, at Indian River Memorial Hospital in Vero Beach, Fla.

He was born at Norcatur on Sept. 21, 1910, the son of Fred and Florence (Croy) Auker. He had lived in Vero Beach since 1974. He was a major league baseball player with the Boston Red Sox and St. Louis Browns and the 1935 World Series Champion Detroit Tigers.

He was nicknamed "Submarine" for his distinctive pitching style, and in later years was known as the last man left who had struck out Babe Ruth. His career spanned 10 seasons and he finished with a 130-101 record, 594 strikeouts and a career 4.42 earned run average. He was inducted into the Michigan and Kansas State University Sports halls of fame.

Mr. Auker was the president of Avco-Bay State, a manufacturer and distributor of industrial abrasive products. Survivors include his wife of 73 years, Mildred Auker, of the home; a son, James Auker, Bingham Farms, Mich.; a grandchild; and a great-grandchild.

A memorial service was held Aug. 9, 2006, at First United Methodist Church in Vero Beach. Arrangements were by Struck Funeral Home of Vero Beach.

George Patton. After D-Day, both the 101st and 94th were sent back to the states. He re-enlisted and was sent to the 4th Cavalry Mechanized Division, as Master Sergeant. He spent most of his service time, about five years, in Europe.

> After he was discharged on Sept. 3,1948, he returned to McCook. He became a brick mason and masonry contractor.

> He married Virginia Gonzales in Atwood in 1949, and they became the parents of nine children. She preceded him in death. He later married Stockville, Neb., on May 16, 1990, and she had six children, Dick, Barbara, Rosalie, Roderick, Rodney, and Carol.


She was born May 25, 1933, the daughter of Paul and Esther (Jording) Hoffbauer. She was a 1951 graduate of Decatur Community High School.






