DECATUR COUNTY RESOLUTION NO.

A resolution expressing the property taxation policy of the Decatur County Commissioners

with respect to financing the 2007 budget for WHEREAS, K.S.A. 79-2925b provides that resolution be adopted if property taxes lev-

ied to finance the 2007 Decatur County Budget exceed the amount levied to finance the 2006 Decatur County budget, except with regard to revenue produced and attributable to the taxation of 1) new improvements to real roperty; 2) increased personal property valuation, other than increased valuation of oil and gas leaseholds and mobile homes; and 3) property which has changed in use during the past year, or with regard to revenue produced for the purpose of repaying the principal of and interest upon bonded indebtedness, tempoy notes, or no-fund warrants; and

WHEREAS, budgeting, taxing and service evel decisions for all county services are the responsibility of the board of county commissioners; and

WHEREAS, Decatur County provides the essential services to protect the health, safety nd well being of the citizens of the county; and WHEREAS, the 2005 Kansas State Legis-

lature failed to fulfill its obligations in regard to the statutory funding of demand transfers and. buy significantly limiting state revenue sharing payments to counties, has contributed to higher county property tax levies to finance the 2007 Decatur County Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BEIT RESOLVED by the Board of Decatur County Commissioners that is our desire to notify the public of the possibility of increased property taxes to finance the 2007 Decatur County Budget due to the above mentioned constraints, and that all persons are invited and encouraged to attend the budget meeting conducted by the Board of Decatur County Commissioners. The date and time of budget hearings with the Board of Decatur County Commissioners will be published in the Oberlin Herald in the September 13th 2006 publication.


