 A Christmas Eve communion service will begin at 5 p.m.

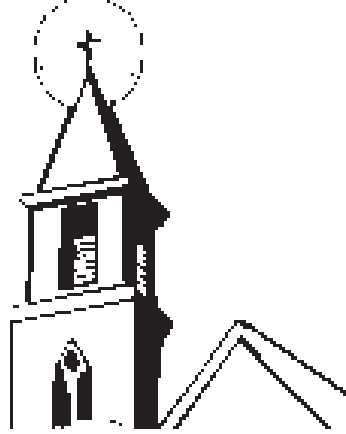
