Cynthia Haynes, second and Mr. Bergling, third.

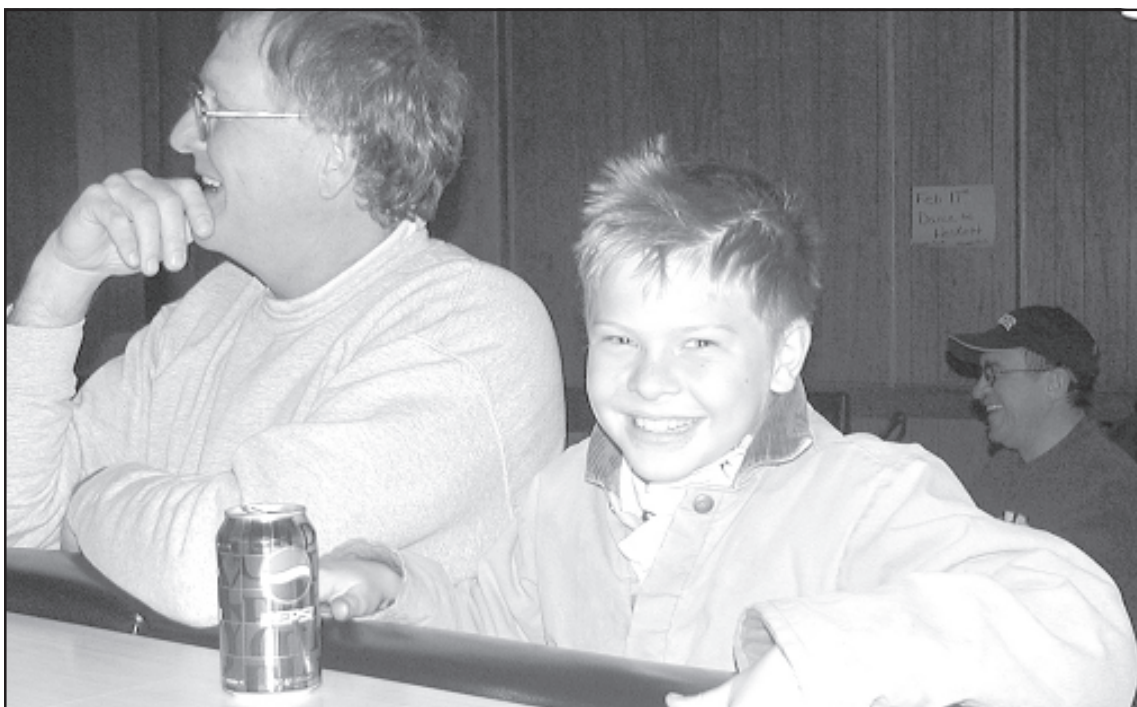
In the "other" category, winners were Deb Klima, first, Patti Uehlin, second and Dorothy Woods, third for her chicken enchiladas.
