County didn't get grants for center roof, bridge work

The Decatur County commissioners heard from the road and bridge supervisor that the county didn't get a Community Development Block Grant to redo the roof at the Golden Age Center or to put in a new bridge.

Supervisor Tim Stallman said he would work on getting the money for the bridge in a later year. County Clerk Marilyn Horn said the seniors from the Golden Age Center would be in at the next meeting to talk about the building.

Mr. Stallman said he attended a Federal Emergency Management Agency meeting, where he learned that only 48 hours of storm cleanup work, not 72 hours, can be claimed for federal aid.

A project officer from the agency

will be out soon to discuss the city's costs from storms this winter and look at the damage, he said.

Four or five township officers came to the meeting and filled out the forms for damage. Mr. Stallman said, adding that he filled out the forms for other townships so the agency would have them on record.

The road boss said he is trying to work with utility companies, including Prairie Land Electric, on the work they did to get the roads open so the crews could work on the power lines.

Mrs. Horn said Sharleen Wurm, museum director, was at the meeting also and filled out forms for a leaky roof. Mrs. Horn said she has copies of all of the completed forms for the county.

Mr. Stallman asked the commissioners to ratify his purchase of more supplies for over \$300. He said he would also like authority to get bids on grader blades. The commissioners approved the purchase and the bid letting.

Mr. Stallman said the crew didn't have any major breakdowns during the storms, although one of the graders is down right now.

The main routes in the county are open to the best of the crews' ability, he said, but some of the township roads have only one lane open.

He said he had hired a new employee, Zachary Mader.

The spring township meeting will be held at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, March 20, in the courtroom, commissioners said.
