

Two beat record Swimmers take second at first meet

The Oberlin summer swim team placed second out of 10 teams in its first meet on Saturday in Holyoke, Colo.

- The mixed boys and girls relay team, ages 11-12, 200-yard freestyle relay team of J. Risewick, May, Rouse, Soderlund, first.

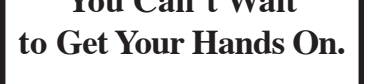
"We were proud of all the swimmers," said Coach Stephanie Blau. "They all did exceptional."
