This year, though, the council was presented a discussion draft, not the actual audit.

City Administration Gary Shike said there weren't any surprises in the audit and the city hadn't been written up for any problems.

Councilwoman Rhonda May suggested the council wait until the meeting Thursday, Aug. 23, to accept the report so everyone would have time to look it over.
