First-year senior tight end Sean Ybarra will be in the middle and for blocking during running plays. Stapp will back up Ybarra.

Coach Williams said his main concern will be replacing his 2007 graduating senior line, who averaged over 250 pounds each.

On the line will be seniors Colt Diedrich, Jared Marcuson and David Urban; juniors Nathan Simonsson, Everett Urban, Derek Chambers and Shane Hollars; and sophomores Jaxen Alstrom and Donovan Baumann.

Without good blocking, the Red Devils might be in for a long season. If Oberlin uses its quickness and develops mental toughness, it can

hold its ground and move the ball.


