Kenneth Rex Garver, 85, a native of Oberlin, died Nov. 6, 2007 at Country Place Senior Living in Clay Center.

He was born at Oberlin on June 19, 1922, the son of James Franklin and Jessie (Wilson) Garver. His father, aunts and uncles came to Kansas on the orphan train.

He attended school in Oberlin and enlisted in the U.S. Navy during World War II. He went to underwater welding school and served with search and rescue on the USS Grasp and USS Lexington.

He married Nola Ridgway in 1942, and she preceded him in death on Jan. 25, 1996, after 53 years of marriage.

After serving in the military, he worked with the Kansas Nebraska Natural Gas Company in Phillipsburg. He worked his way to management, a position he held until he retired after 42 years. After retirement, they moved to Bella Vista, Ark. He was a member of the Bella Vista Community Church. He was a 50-year member of the Elks and Masonic Lodge, a past Master in the Masons and was also a member of the Shriners. He moved to Clay

Center in 2006.

Survivors include two daughters, Meredith and Lynn Schneider, Washington, and Leanne James, Naperville, Ill.; a sister, Peggy May, Atlanta, Ga.; four grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren. Rita Garver of Oberlin is a sister-in-law.

He was also preceded in death by his parents; two brothers, Virgil and Ray Garver; and two sisters, Mamie Unger and Mary McDougal.

A graveside memorial service was held Tuesday afternoon at the Oberlin Cemetery.
