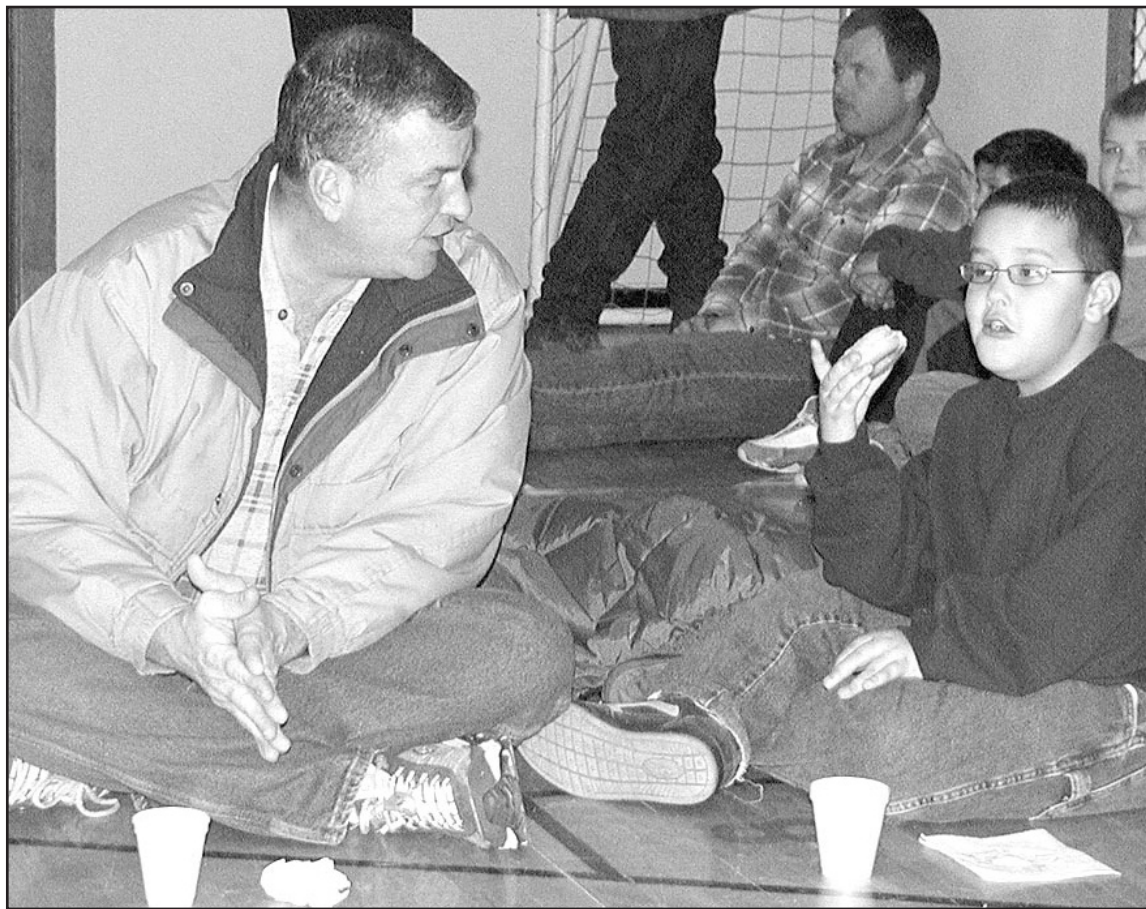

The fathers of the elementary students were invited to the school before classes started last Wednesday for the annual Donuts for Dads day.

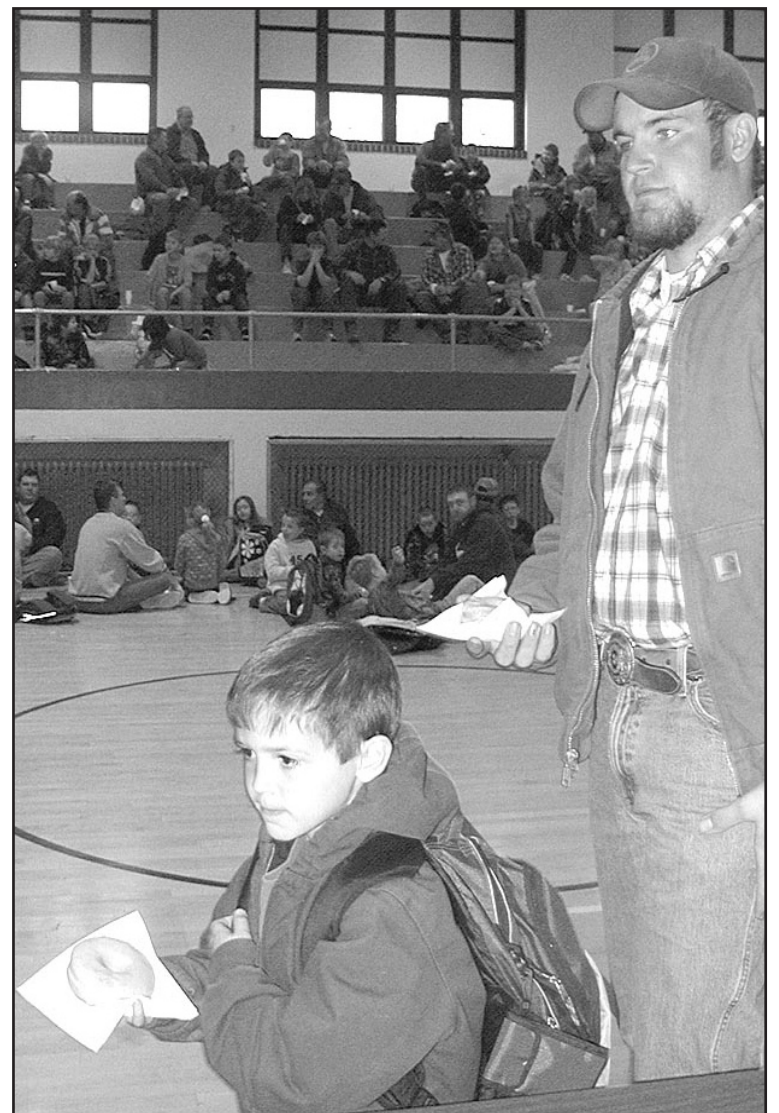
Since last year, the Supporting Our Schools group has sponsored the morning event to show appreciation for fathers.

"I think we had a better turnout than last year," said Principal Duane Dorshorst, "It was great to see all of the dads sitting around and visiting with the kids and the other dads."

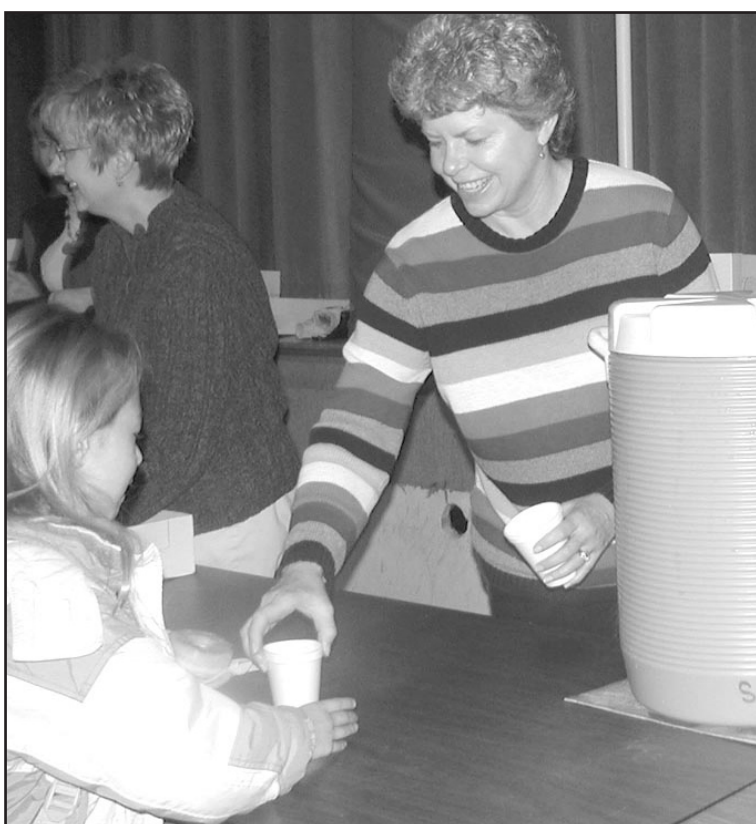
According to Mr. Dorshorst, more dads also stayed and spent some time in their child's classroom this year.
