



Atwood Country Club offers golfers a challenging nine-hole experience. The course features well-manicured grass greens framed with creeks and trees, located directly north of Lake Atwood.

The golf course was originally sand greens which were converted to grass greens in 1996. Creeks come into play on six of the nine holes as players wind their way around 80 to 100 feet tall cottonwood trees. Bluegrass fairways were added in 2000.

In the years between 2000 and 2006, 350 new trees were planted on the golf course. Forty-one different varieties promise a colorful array of foliage throughout the year.
