Travelers can cross the bridge north of the intersection of Highway 36 and Highway 25 and see a windmill styled like those which graced the landscape in pioneer days.

Frank Dozbaba built the windmill in the 1950s for his brother, Anton. Frank made the vanes of wood; the tail is weighted with a 60-pound concrete "football."

The well was hand-dug, and the water was

pumped for irrigation of Anton's property at the corner of Blaine St. and Highway 25 in Atwood.

The windmill was donated to the Rawlins County Historical Society after Anton died, and was moved to its present location to be enjoyed by sight-seers.


