# Three juniors will be going to Wichita for state music honors

Nearly one hundred of the best high school musicians from across the state have been chosen for the state Kansas Music Educator's Association honor band. Two Decatur Community High School juniors are among those — Alyssa Rippe and Chris Larson.

The two auditioned in Salina on Saturday, Jan. 5, and will spend Feb. 28-March 1 in Wichita, practicing and performing.

Over one hundred flutists auditioned for the state band, but only ten were accepted. Alyssa was chosen as the second chair.

Twenty-four clarinetists, including Chris, were chosen out of 115. To be eligible for state auditions, Alyssa and Chris were first chosen for the Kansas Music Educator's Association district honor band in
