Board approves new plan to run alternative classroom

The Oberlin School Board at its meeting last Tuesday approved starting an alternative classroom at the high school, with students using a computer program to complete courses with help from a teacher.

The classroom would help kids who are struggling, said Superintendent Pat Cullen. The board would need to approve hiring another teacher for the class, he said, and buying a computer program.

The teacher isn't really an additional staff member, said Principal Charlie Haag, since one teacher has gone to part-time and another has quit, effective at the end of the school year.

The idea is to buy eight to 10 licenses for a computer program, he said. That way, the classroom can help up to 10 students at the same time.

The Northwest Kansas Educational Service Center uses the A Plus program, said Dr. Cullen, and they want to look into that.

The first proposal was to have the alternative class meet at the old Sappa Valley Youth Ranch, but administrators decided they had room in the high school and wouldn't have to bus kids.

Frances Pearl "Frankie" McIntyre, 94, a longtime resident of Rexford, died April 15, 2008, at the Citizens Medical Center in Colby.

She was born April 1, 1914, in Colby, the daughter of Frank and Pearl (Garrison) Lamberson. She attended Colby Elementary School and graduated from Colby High School in 1932 and Bethany College in Lindsborg in 1934. She then moved to Rexford where she taught in the elementary school.

She married Cleo Clyde McIntyre on June 1, 1937, in Concordia. Later that year, they moved into a new home they built in Rexford, where they lived their entire married life and operated W. S. McIntyre and Sons.

In 1963, she re-entered the teaching field as a grade school vocal music teacher in Rexford, then at Golden Plains Elementary School in Selden when the schools unified. She retired in 1974. She also taught private piano lessons for 64 years and took many correspondence courses from the University of Kansas, Kansas State University and Fort Hays State University.

She joined the Rexford Community Church in 1939 and served as a pianist, organist. Sunday School teacher, music director and mission worker. She was a Cub Scout den mother and a member of Young Women's Christian Association, Happy Hour Unit and Lioness Club.

Survivors include a son, and daughter-in-law, Frank and Darla McIntyre, Tucson, Ariz.; six grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her husband on April 22, 1990; her parents; a son, Joel McIntyre; and a sister, Cretta Mae Kinkel.

Funeral services were held Saturday morning at the Rexford Community Church. The Rev. Lane Purcell officiated and burial was in the Rexford Cemetery.
