Oberlin boys team gets third in Oakley

The Decatur Community High boys track team took third and the girls, fourth, at the Oakley Invitational meet on Friday.

The Oberlin boys were led by Jacob Fortin, who took two firsts and Andrew Richards, who also came in ahead of the pack.

The Rawlins County boys took top honors with 75 points followed by Wallace County, 68; Oberlin, 66; Oakley, 63; Triplains, 54; St. Francis, 52; Quinter, 51; Hoxie, 37; Golden Plains, 31; Wheatland/Grinnell, 19; and Brewster, 10.

The Rawlins County girls took first with 107 points followed by Triplains, 100; Oakley, 95; Oberlin,

91; Hoxie, 68; Wallace County, 34; Cheylin, 21; Wheatland/Grinnell, 13; St. Francis, 9; and Brewster, 8. Golden Plains did not score.

The Lady Red Devils were led by first place finishes from Heather Glodt, Brandi Diederich and the 4x100 and 4x400 relay teams.

With gasoline prices at record highs, why not take a fishing and camping trip to North Delaney Butte, outside of Walden, Colo.

It's time to check out a new hybrid, the tiger trout.
