

(Continued from Page 1A) Although he might be able to salvage a little bit from his home, Mr. Robey, said most of his belongings were destroyed by the fire and smoke. Besides losing his belongings, a couple of his cats died in the blaze.

He said he's staying with Maurice Zodrow, assistant manager at Raye's, until he can move into a new rental. Mr. Brown, said Mr. Robey, derstanding in a news story. Please has purchased a house at 205 S. Marks that he will rent.

Mr. Robey, an Army veteran, has worked at Raye's since July 1984 and lived in Oberlin since 1978. He's faced hard times before, suffering a stroke and a heart attack in 2001 at the age of 35.
