Carolina rig great for catching big mouth bass

Now that we are in the thick of large-mouth bass fishing, one of the best ways to catch "Ol' Bucket-mouth," is with a Carolina plastic worm rig.

For us old-school bass fishermen who grew up in the 1960s, a Carolina rig is what we called a "split shot rig" or a "swivel worm rig."

The Carolina rig is one of the best ways to fool those bad-attitude big boys.

This rig is set up separating the hook and plastic worm from the lead with a leader.

Setting up the rig is easy, just slip a bullet sinker, then slide a plastic red or bright orange bead on the line, attach a barrel swivel and tie off the rig with palmor knot.

Now tie your leader line to the opposite end of the barrel swivel.

You may have to experiment with the length of your leader to find the best length for your situation.

The sinker should vary in weight from a 1/8-ounce to one-ounce lead sinker. If you don't have a bullet sinker, you can use an egg-slip sinker.

The rule of thumb is the larger the sinker, the longer the leader. Leader

length can be from under a foot to as much as six-feet.

Gravel points and bushes are the best places to fish the rig. I try to insert the hook into the plastic worm so it will not get hung up fishing in weeds.

Flip the rig into the brush pile and let the sinker hit bottom, the plastic worm or lizard will follow,

be prepared for the bass to strike on the fall.

One thing that is good about the rig is that you can cover a lot of ground in a short time.

I personally "cut the pie," or cast as if I were cutting a pie at 45-degree angles, taking four cuts of the pie in each area that I fish.

If the fish are finicky, I change colors, but I never spend more than 20-30 minutes in an area if they aren't biting.

You can also vary your presentation by using a floating worm rig using a Styrofoam floating sinker in front of the worm.

This method drives bass nuts and it is also one of the cheapest rigs that a fisherman can make.
