

Dealership sells more than autos

At the intersection of U.S. 36 and U.S. 83, a former probation officer opened a used-car dealership offering just about anything with wheels.

In January 2007, Barry Richards opened the doors to Stellar Sales and a month later he started to sell cars, vans, trucks and a wide range of other merchandise.

At the time, Mr. Richards said, he had picked up some overstocked and discontinued items out of Denver that he was selling, including kerosene, electric and propane heaters, window air-conditioning units, small refrigerators, exercise equipment, chain saws and other odds and ends.

Since opening, he said, he has expanded what he offers to include scooters, four wheelers, mo-

torcycles, go carts, Pride of the Prairie Livestock equipment and Pro-track and Travalong trailers. Mr. Richards said Stellar also sells Ranch Hand grill guards and replacement bumpers.

Probably the biggest seller are four-wheel-drive pickups, he said.

"We have the ability to locate about anything anyone needs with wheels on it," he said.

Over the year, he said, he's added a full-time salesman and four part-time.

Mr. Richards is the manager, Jim Weigel handles sales, Kristen McHugh accounting and sales, and Doug Powell, Ken Badsky and Gary Richards, part-time sales.

The business is open from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday.
