May I suggest another important thing to implement during your summer season – some time away with the Lord – a summer retreat! Retreats are not only for priests and the religious. Jesus invites all of his disciples to go away with him to a quiet place. Retreat houses across our country offer wonderful and inexpensive opportunities for prayer and reflection.

A simple journal during retreat helps to recognize God's action in our hearts. Retreats send us back to our daily routines missioned in the fire of the Holy Spirit and enlivened in the startling belief that Jesus, God's only Son, is risen from the dead.

What is usually meant by a directed retreat? Basically, it is a type of retreat which focuses on the personal prayer of the individual. The focus is on the unique experience of God in the prayer of the individuals faith of God.

divided into certain periods. First of all, there are experience becomes clearer in our own mind. distinct times of prayer during which one is directly

Summer is in full swing, and I'm sure you've open to God. Secondly, the retreaters seek to become more aware of where God has touched them and led them by attempting to single out and become more conscious of the key movements, feelings, calls and attractions that have taken place in their prayer. And thirdly, there should be periods of relaxation and rest, for very little is accomplished in an atmosphere of strain and weariness.

Hopefully each person can find the right daily rhythm of prayer, reflection and relaxation in an atmosphere of peace and calm. The important thing is to be alone with God in a spirit of silence and simplicity; for it is in this climate that one can best experience the gentle promptings of the Holy Spirit. Retreaters often are pleasantly surprised at their own capacity to pray and the amount of time they can devote to prayer. In prayer, we do seek to become more aware of our inner selves and to become more sensitive to what God is communicating of himself and his love.


