Water usage remains low

Water use stayed low last week with cooler temperatures and half an inch of rain.

The Oberlin City Council voted to go to outdoor water restrictions last month, basically allowing for every-other-day watering.

Until the council votes to go back to regular water use, city water users are on the restrictions, even though people are using a lot less water than they were.

That means people with odd-numbered addresses can water on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, and those with even addresses on Wednesday, Friday and Sunday. No outdoor use is allowed on Mondays.

Outdoor water can be used only from midnight to 9 a.m. and 8 p.m. to midnight on the specified days. That includes watering lawns and gardens, washing cars, filling swimming pools and any other kind of outdoor use.

- 403,200 gallons on Monday, Aug. 11, with the high temperature at 72.
- 637,800 gallons on Tuesday, Aug. 12, high 84.
- 446,600 gallons last Wednesday, high 90.
- 533,000 gallons on Thursday, high 91.
- 396,000 gallons on Friday, high 81.

- 417,000 gallons on Saturday, high 81.
- 331,000 gallons on Sunday, high 77.

and movie theater go up.

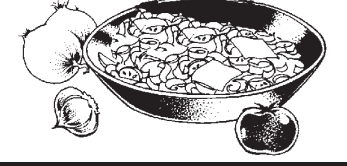
The dance, from 7 to 10 p.m., will be open to everyone. Mr. Wenger said it's a fund raiser for the new building.

Ellen Margaret Kennedy, 97, a native of Kanona, died Saturday, Aug. 16, 2008, at the Cambridge Manor.

She was born Oct. 25, 1910, in Kanona, the daughter of Joseph and Margaret (Janousek) Fiala. At the age of two, her mother died in childbirth and she was raised by her paternal aunt, Anne Locy. She graduated from high school at Hugo, Colo., in 1929. She attended the Conservatory of Music in Fort Collins, Colo., for a year.

She returned to Kansas where she married Fred Raymond Kennedy on Jan. 6, 1934, in Norton. In 1938 they moved to the family farm south of Bartley, Neb. At the age of 56 she obtained her licensed practical nursing degree at Fort Collins, Colo., then returned to Nebraska to help open the Long-Term Care Wing at Cambridge.

She was active in the Domestic Abuse program providing a safe house for women and their children and was also involved in several women's organizations. She especially enjoyed traveling, including her trips to Europe and the Holy Lands.

Survivors include her five children, Patrick and Joyce Kennedy, Farmington Hills, Mich.; Jon and Gloria Kennedy, Arlington, Texas; Kathryn and Lyle Shirley, Long Beach, Calif.; Sally and Larry Sitzman, Lincoln, Neb., and Fred and Holly Kennedy, Indianola; 15 grandchildren; two step-grandchildren; 21 great-grandchildren; and one great-great-grandchild.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband in 1971; two brothers, Edward and Carl Fiala, and a grandson, Douglas Kennedy.
