Water use stayed low last week with cooler temperatures and half

The Oberlin City Council voted to go to outdoor water restrictions last month, basically allowing for

every-other-day watering. Until the council votes to go back to regular water use, city water users are on the restrictions, even though people are using a lot less water than

That means people with odd- Aug. 12, high 84. numbered addresses can water on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, high 90. and those with even addresses on Wednesday, Friday and Sunday. No outdoor use is allowed on Mon-

Outdoor water can be used only from midnight to 9 a.m. and 8 p.m. high 81. to midnight on the specified days. That includes watering lawns and high 77. gardens, washing cars, filling swimming pools and any other kind of outdoor use.
