Students to learn archery skills

Physical education students at the Decatur Community High School will be getting out of the gym and learning some new skills thanks to donations from Pheasants Forever and the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks archery program.

Oberlin's Activities Director Joe Dreher attended an archery instructor's course in the spring and because of that the state is donating \$500 for equipment to the school. The local Pheasants Forever chapter is also donating \$500 so that the school program can get fletched and flying.

Mr. Dreher said that he has been teaching archery in his physical edu-

cation classes but that the equipment was outdated. The money received, he said, will go to purchase seven compound bows and five dozen arrows for the students.

Archery, he said, has been around for hundreds of years and is a great hobby as well as good exercise and an Olympic sport.

There is a National Archery in schools program being introduced across the country, he said, to help students get a jump start on archery safety and proper shooting techniques.

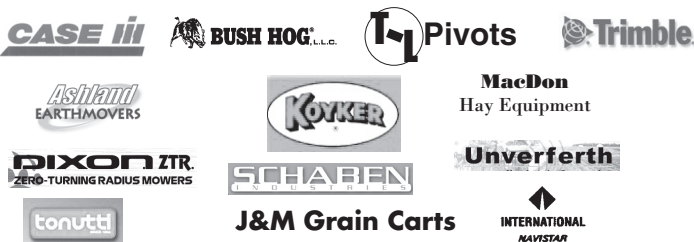
