Marcille Berryman, 72, a 1954 graduate of Decatur Community High School, died Thursday, Aug. 21, 2008, in Denver from cancer.

She was born April 18, 1936, at Oberlin, the daughter of Arthur and Lucille (Anderson) Holmberg. She attended four rural grade schools. After her father's death, she was the owner of the family farm and continued to manage it for another 30 years.

She completed a Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology from Hastings College in Hastings Neb., then completed a Master of Science degree in Guidance and Counseling from the University of Nebraska in Lincoln. She was a Licensed Professional Counselor in Colorado, a National Certified Counselor and a National Certified Career Counselor. She was a career counselor, administrator and teacher at several colleges in Nebraska and Colorado.

Survivors include her husband, Boyd Berryman, and four children from a previous marriage, Tom and Paula Coulter; Lori Coulter, Meg Coulter and Tim and Jane Coulter.

Memorial services will be held at 10 a.m. on Saturday at the Horan and McComaty Funeral Home, 3201 S. Parker Road, in Aurora, Colo. The Rev. Monty Newton will officiate and inurnment will follow.

Ivan Joseph Janning, 85, husband of former Oberlin resident Bettie (Kolsky) Janning, died on Friday, Aug. 8, 2008, at his home in Storm Lake, Iowa.

He was born July 16, 1923, in Carroll County, Iowa, the son of George and Mary (Mueller) Janning. He was reared on a farm in Carroll County, and was baptized at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Church in Mount Carmel, Iowa. He attended early grade school at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic School. His family moved to a farm in Buena Vista County, and he attended St. Mary's School in Storm Lake. He was later confirmed at St. Mary's Catholic Church. In 1941, he graduated from St. Mary's High School.

He married Bettie Lee (Kolsky) Thomsen on June 1, 1981, at Lake-side Presbyterian Church in Storm Lake. He was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church and served as a Grand Knight for the Knights of Columbus. He was also a member of the Legion of Mary.

He owned a Storm Lake agricultural business, selling and erecting grain bins, dryers, and conveying equipment. After his retirement in 1994, he also worked extensively to establish the present location of the Buena Vista Work Activities Center for developmentally disabled adults.

Survivors include his wife, Bettie; his daughter, Judy Janning-Reicks and husband, Allen, Pella, Iowa; his sons, David and Sharon Janning, Storm Lake; and Thomas and Jeannie Janning, Sparks, Nev.; six grandchildren; five great-grandchildren; two step-children: Ann and Ross Watson, Spencer, Iowa, and Vince and Suna Thomsen, Tampa, Fla.; three step-grandchildren; and two sisters: Henrietta Kestel, Storm Lake, and Mary Nyhus, Sioux City, Iowa.

He was also preceded in death by his parents; an infant son; two daughters: Jerelyn Vance and Jane Janning; and two grandchildren, Debra and Ryan Vance in a plane crash in August, 1975; and four brothers: Joseph, Clarence, Paul, and Cletus.

Funeral Mass was held Aug. 11, 2008, at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Storm Lake. Burial was in St. Mary's Catholic Cemetery. The Fratzke and Jensen Funeral Home of Storm Lake was in charge of the arrangements.
