Groups to discuss merging

Three Oberlin Business Alliance members will work with a delegation from the Decatur County Area Chamber of Commerce to discuss the ins and outs of merging the two groups.

Members of the two met to discuss the idea, said Kurt Vollertsen, owner of Ward Drug Store, during an alliance meeting last Wednesday. The consensus from both groups is to merge, he said.

Delegates from each organization will meet and work on the structure of dues and other items, said Mr. Vollertsen. Gary Walter, president of The Bank, Joe Stanley of Stanley Hardware and Mr. Vollertsen said they will represent the alliance.

At this point, he added, the merger is just a discussion.

Kem Bryan, chamber board chair, said the group is looking for a secretary/manager. There's an ad in the newspaper this week, she said.

Mrs. Bryan said the chamber board had kicked around some ideas for a membership drive. She said she didn't know if the alliance and the Chamber wanted to do a member-

ship drive together or separately.

Connie Grafel, marketing director for the Oberlin-Decatur County Economic Development Corp., and a member of the parade committee, said she's been handing out entry forms for the parade scheduled on Saturday, Oct. 4 for the 50th anniversary of the Last Indian Raid Museum. Some of the forms have also been mailed out, she said.

The alliance members chose between two trophies for first place.

Someone mentioned that the alliance should hand out a letter to the parade entries telling people that they could add lights and enter the same thing in the annual Parade of Lights the night after Thanksgiving.

In other business, the members:

- Agreed to write a letter to support a project Undersheriff Randy McHugh is heading up to put a state emergency response training facility at the former Sappa Valley Youth Ranch.
- Heard the alliance will have a tailgate barbecue in City Park from 5 to 7 p.m. on Friday before the

Decatur Community High football game.

- Talked briefly about decorating downtown with corn stalks in time for the anniversary parade.
- Agreed to put wording saying "no change or cash or no currency value" on the Santa Bucks this year. That way, someone wouldn't be able to buy something for \$1 and then get the \$9 back in cash.
