Sidney Clyde Dillinger, 96, a former Methodist Church pastor at Dresden, Selden, Traer, Jennings and Rexford, died Saturday, Oct. 18, 2008, at the Long Term Care Unit of the Jewell County Hospital in Mankato.

He was born July 3, 1912, the son of Troy Clyde and Amanda (Thompson) Dillinger in a sod house in Sherman County. He attended country schools and graduated from Brewster High School in 1931. He earned degrees from Kansas Wesleyan University in 1935 and from the Garrett Biblical Institute in 1938. His first appointment was to the Traer Methodist Episcopal Church in Decatur County.

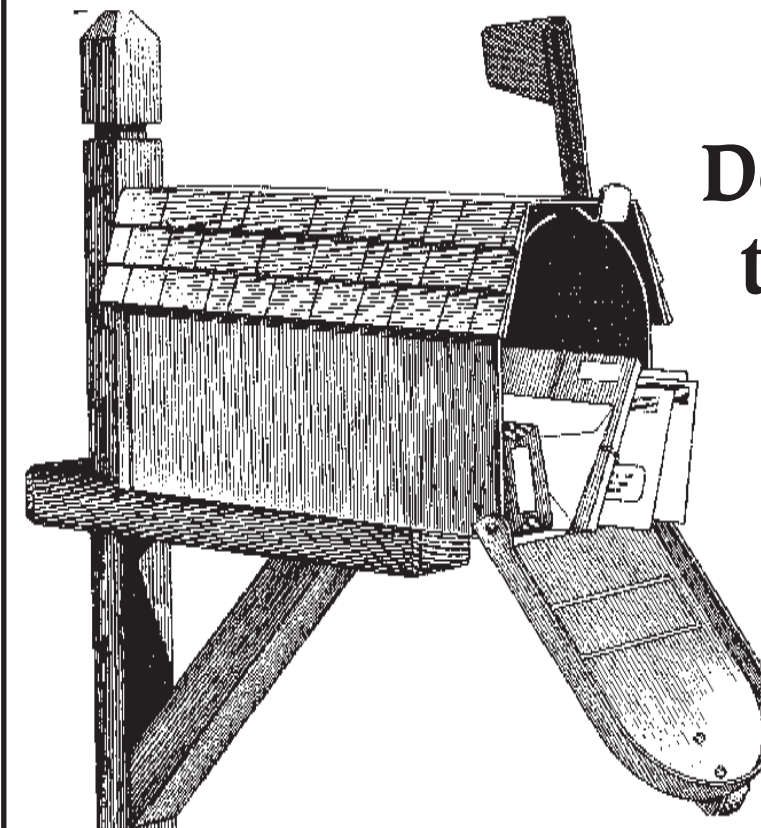
