RESOLUTION TO APPROVE PROPOSED
EXTENSION DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Board of County Com-
missioners of Decatur County, Kansas, is
authorized to approve an agreement pertaining
to proposed extension districts created under
K.S.A. 2-623, et seq.; and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Decatur
County Extension Council to join the Norton
County Extension Council in forming an exten-
sion district pursuant to K.S.A. 2-623; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to K.S.A. 2-623(i)
prior to approving the agreement of the pro-
posed extension district, the Board of County
Commissioners of Decatur County, Kansas, is
required to provide certain notice.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by
the Board of County Commissioners of Decatur
County, Kansas, that it is the intention of the
Board of County Commissioners of Decatur
County, Kansas, to approve an agreement to
join the Decatur County Extension Council to
permit the Norton County Extension Council in
forming an extension district pursuant to K.S.A.
2-623, et seq.; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the
Board of County Commissioners of Decatur
County recognizes that it is possible that the
Board of County Commissioners or voters in
one of these other counties may disapprove
that county's joining the district. It is the in-
tention of the Board of County Commissioners
of Decatur County, to join with the aforemen-
tioned county.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the
Board of County Commissioners of Decatur
County shall have for its sole pur-
pose the giving of instruction and practical
demonstration in agriculture, marketing, home
economics (family and consumer sciences),
4-H Club and youth work, community and re-
source development, and economic develop-
ment initiatives to all persons in the extension
district and the imparting of such persons of
information on the subjects through practical
demonstrations, meetings, publications, or
otherwise in accordance with the program and
service prescribed by the governing body of the
extension district; and,

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that if, within
sixty (60) days following the last publication of
this resolution, a petition in opposition to the
approval of the agreement and the inclusion
of Decatur County in the extension district is
signed by not less than five percent (5%) of the
qualified electors of Decatur County and filed
with the Decatur County election officer, the
Board of County Commissioners of Decatur
County, Kansas, will not approve the agree-
ment and Decatur County will not be included
in the Extension district unless and until the
agreement is approved by a majority of the
qualified electors of Decatur County voting
at a primary or a general election or a special
election called and held for such purpose. This
resolution shall become effective the day and
year below written.
