Club hears center update

gave an update on the progress of the new Golden Age/Recreation Center at the Nov. 25 meeting of the Oberlin Rotary Club at The Gateway.

He said that the Oberlin-Decatur County Economic Development Corp. and the county are trying to wrap up the money package and cost estimates for the building. It will house a new senior center, cinema and youth recreation area with a six-lane bowling alley.

The building will be at the site of the existing Golden Age Center and theater. The senior center will include a new kitchen and larger area in Phase I. Phase II will be a cinema with new seating, a digital sound system and a new screen. The third phase will be the bowling alley complex and an area that can be used for other recreation.

The architect is finishing the drawings for final bids on the interior utilities, he said. The county has bids in hand totaling \$461,000 for building erection and concrete

Program chair Greg Lohoefener work. Total cost estimated to complete Phases I and II is \$750,000, Mr. Lohoefener said.

Current money sources include Decatur County bonds, an Economic Development Corp. guaranteed loan from the U.S. Department of Agriculture and private donations and pledges totaling over \$250,000. He said the project is about \$30,000 short of having enough to complete the senior center and theater.

Construction is to begin in February, with completion next summer and the building open by August, during the Decatur County Fair. Mr. Lohoefener expressed appreciation for contributions and assistance from various committees, the Bank, the commissioners, members of the Economic Development board, as well as many citizens.


