Deputy Jay Tate said the truck flipped when Mr. Ketterl rounded a corner, which shifted the load on the trailer. The accident happened at the intersection of EE Lane and Road 500, which is a gravel road out of Traer just before crossing into Nebraska.

John Francis Schuhart, 93, a longtime resident of Cedar Living Center in Oberlin, died Saturday, Dec. 6, 2008, at the Hays Regional Medical Center in Hays.

He was born Aug. 24, 1915, in a sod house located along the Solomon River in Sheridan County, the

son of Peter J. and Anna (Ritter) Shuhart.

He was reared on the home place south of Leoville and attended Green Valley Rural School and Immaculate Conception Catholic Church. From an early age, he helped on the farm. He served in the United States Army during World War II from September 1942 until January 1946, then returned to the farm.
