Sports Boys finish season

The Decatur Community High boys basketball team ended its season with a first-round loss to Plainville last Monday in the substate tournament.

Plainville was the host for the substate, which included teams from St. Francis, Atwood, WaKeeney, Stockton, Hill City and Ellis.

The 65-50 loss took the Red Devils' season to 7-14.

The Oberlin boys held the game close in the first quarter, although Plainville came out ahead 10-9. The second quarter was a different story, as Plainville outscored the Red Devils 23-6 to take a 33-15 lead into the half.

Oberlin came out of the locker room fired up and the boys were able to outscore Plainville 22-18. The fourth quarter was another close one, with Plainville scoring 14 to Oberlin's 13.

Playing for Oberlin were Lucas Juenemann 15 points, four assists, four steals and two rebounds; Logan Fortin, 10 points, seven rebounds, three assists and two steals; Toby Peters, 10 points, six rebounds, three assists and a steal; Dakota Soderlund, 8 points, a rebound and a steal; Sam Stapp, 7 points and two rebounds; Josh Ritter, four rebounds and two assists; Wiley Farr, a rebound and a steal; and Keithen Fortin an assist.

Girls suffer • tough loss

The Decatur Community High basketball girls ended their season last Tuesday with a tough 58-54 loss to Stockton in the first round of substate tournament play.

Also playing in the girls substate at Stockton were teams from Ellis, St. Francis, Plainville, Hill City, WaKeeney and Atwood. The loss put the Oberlin girls' record at 5-15 for the season. "I thought this was a well-played game by both teams," said Coach Terry Ream. "I was happy with the way we handled the ball, but we gave up too many rebounds and loose balls, ultimately deciding the game." The Oberlin Lady Red Devils had the lead at the end of the first quarter, outscoring Stockton 16-12. Stockton came back to outscore Oberlin 13-10 in the second period. That left Oberlin with a 16-15 lead at the half. In the third quarter, both teams scored 12 and Oberlin retained the one-point lead. In the fourth quarter, however, Stockton came out and scored 17 to Oberlin's 10 for the victory and a chance to advance to the semifinals. "We had great success when we got the ball inside to Adrienne (Pauls) and Mary (Olson)," Coach Ream said. "We have worked hard getting the inside players involved, and when we did, the two stepped up and did a great job. "This was a tough way to end our season, but these girls had great attitudes and worked hard from the start of the season until the end.'
